

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (Year C) **SUNDAY 2nd DECEMBER 2018**



The Advent wreath can be a powerful symbol. In a world of instant service, of 59 minute delivery and 24 hours a day communication the Advent Wreath reminds us that waiting can be good. Each Sunday we light one more candle, and we see that there are still others to be lit. Advent is about waiting for the Messiah. Not wasting time, but expectant waiting. Waiting that is about longing, about yearning. Waiting

that does not sell-out to the premature festivity of the tinsel and the mistletoe, the commercial excuse for profit, the Christless jollity. Advent waiting is an invitation to grow, to ponder, to reflect and to be grateful. It's not instant. It's mellow. And it's rewarding.
