

12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) SUNDAY 20TH JUNE 2021

"They woke him and said to him, 'We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. ". (Mark 4:39)

All Jesus' activity in Galilee points to the approach of the kingdom. All this precedes his journey to Jerusalem, and his ministry there which leads to his death and resurrection. The mighty work, or miracle, about which we hear in today's gospel reading, is the calming of a storm on the Sea of Galilee. Along with the parables, the miracles are a major feature of Jesus' ministry in Mark's gospel. Most of the miracles of Jesus are healings. The miracles show the power of Jesus over natural forces, as his words calm the sea and the winds. Our first reading from the Book of Job gives a poetic description of God's power in limiting the extent of the seas. The effect of the words of Jesus is instant. He has the power of God. Jesus questions the disciples about their fear and their lack of faith, but the passage ends with their question about Jesus. 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.' The awe they experience - the Greek text says 'they feared with a great fear' - is the reaction of someone in the presence of God. The disciples will be searching for an answer to their question throughout the gospel. What is the meaning of the miracles of Jesus? Pray for a deeper awareness of the purpose of Jesus and the gospel. Pray for those who struggle to accept the truth about Jesus.
